

Better phone photos in 5 minutes

No scanner. No lightbox. No perfect camera roll.

A flat surface and a nearby window are enough.



The three-photo checklist

01 Go near a window

Use bright, indirect daylight. Turn off overhead lights if they create glare.

02 Lay the art flat

Place it on a simple surface. Smooth curled corners with small, removable weights.

03 Shoot straight down

Keep your phone parallel to the artwork and leave a little space around every edge.

A QUICK EXAMPLE

What good looks like

We remove the surface, square the artwork, and neutralize the photographed paper.

RESTORED ARTWORK

Tiny fixes that help

- Wipe the camera lens.
- Avoid flash and strong shadows.
- Send the original file, not a screenshot.

Organize without overthinking

Pick the 20 pieces you would miss most.

A mix of polished favorites and funny everyday drawings makes the best book.

Photograph one artwork per image. If a piece has a back, photograph that separately.

Do not add names to file names. We will confirm the book title with you directly.



FINAL CHECK

Ready when you are

Before sending, confirm:

-  Every artwork is fully visible
-  Photos are sharp when zoomed in
-  No faces or personal documents appear in frame
-  You selected no more than 20 artworks

Keep the art. Lose the clutter.
